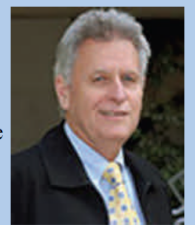

Professor Bob Conway is Dean of the School of Education at Flinders University. His background is as a teacher in both mainstream and special education. His main research and teaching is in the area of students with behaviour problems in both mainstream and specialist settings. He works with education systems to improve the management of students with behaviour problems, particularly in the ways in which student management, learning and teaching can be addressed concurrently. He also has a strong interest in the inclusion of students with a range of special needs in mainstream education and the ways in which education systems adapt learning and teaching strategies to meet the needs of all students.



Professor Chris Forlin has extensive experience in special and inclusive education, equity and diversity, policy and practice, together with the development of innovative curricula and pedagogy for teacher education. Her work with systems and schools to establish sustainable inclusive education provides leadership in education reform throughout the Asian Pacific region. She has widespread international experience, working in the field of special education for more than 35 years. She has advised the Hong Kong government task force on developing a New Senior Secondary School Curriculum for students with intellectual disabilities; the Education Bureau on leadership training for whole schooling, and has been a consultant to the *European Agency for Development in Special Needs Education* and UNESCO on inclusive education policy; and the Vietnam Ministry of Education and Training on developing curricula for preparing teachers for inclusion. Professor Forlin instigated the *Federation in Community Support* (FICS) website for Hong Kong teachers, professionals and parents, and the

Asia Pacific Partnership for Learning Behaviour, for which she is a Hong Kong Director. She has published in excess of 90 articles in refereed international journals or books and her most recent book (2010) is *Teacher Education for Inclusion: Changing Paradigms and Innovative Approaches* (Routledge).

Ruth Phillips is a highly experienced consultant, trainer and educator, with 15 years of educational expertise. Ruth is a trained educator with qualifications in psychology and is currently working towards her doctorate at the University of Wollongong. She has worked in many contexts professionally developing and facilitating change with executive, middle management, and staff throughout Australia. She has worked with middle and senior management supporting executive staff in the development of the skills in authentic leadership, effective communication and leading creative innovation teams. Beginning her career as a Secondary School teacher, Ruth moved quickly into specialised program design and delivery, and ran the Gifted and Talented Education program at a number of independent high schools in NSW. From this experience, Ruth branched out into consulting to schools across Australia, developing and delivering programs to Principals, Department Heads and Teachers.

She has taught at the undergraduate and post graduate level at UNSW for the past 10 years, and has presented practical workshops, delivered keynote presentations and facilitated change in a wide variety of contexts across Australia. Her breadth of experience has covered areas such as developing resilience and optimism, leadership and change, and providing learning for the wide variety of individual needs.

She has also presented papers at International and Australian Education Conferences, including those of the Australian and Victorian Associations for Gifted and Talented Children, and has presented at the pre-eminent international Wallace Research Symposium on Talent Development in May 2010 in Iowa, USA.

Ruth has been involved in designing and delivering professional development packages in a variety of contexts for short term and long term implementation. Ruth has co-authored publications including, the DEST Gifted Education Professional Development Package, with UNSW (the training package for the Australian Federal Government) and *Perspectives: an English differentiated unit for lower secondary students*.
