

# Caring for Kids in an Online World: Understanding Cyber Bullying & Cyber Safety

*This is a Cross-Sectoral workshop hosted by CEO in collaboration with AISWA and DoE*

## Facilitator: Susan McLean

*Susan McLean is an expert in the area of cyber bullying and cyber safety. Known as the 'cyber cop', Susan served as a member of the Victorian police force for 27 years and was the first officer appointed as the manager of the Victoria Police Cyber Safety Project. Susan is a sought after facilitator and advisor and has delivered keynote presentations, written papers and professional learning for a range of organisations including the schools, government departments and businesses (e.g. the National Centre against Bullying). Susan regularly appears in television, radio and print media in Australia and overseas (e.g. 60 Minutes, Bloomberg and Spanish National News).*

## Target Audience:

Catholic, AISWA and Department of Education principals, members of their leadership teams and staff involved in resolution of issues caused by the misuse of online technologies.

## Course Outcomes:

This cross-sectoral program consists of three separate, full-day, interconnected workshops. Between workshops, participants will be invited to apply knowledge by completing a contextually-relevant task. Through completion of this course, participants will develop:

- an understanding of the nature and consequences of cyber bullying, sexting and online threats for students and their schools
- an understanding of the importance of staff protocols for online interaction in the private and public domains
- an understanding of school-based legal requirements, including the involvement of police, with regard to the management of inappropriate online issues of concern regardless of point-of-origin
- a skills audit which can be used with staff, parents and students when devising a school-based cyber safety and online interaction policy
