2024 PROJECT - BUILDING LEADERSHIP CAPABILITY IN THE EARLY YEARS

AISWA Early Childhood recently commenced an exciting project in collaboration with **Amie Fabry** - **Director of Early Childhood at The Learning Future.**

I draw on my multifaceted experience in teaching, academia, consultancy and research to design and facilitate professional learning programs that empower and enable educators, leaders and children to flourish in early education settings. - Amie Fabry

The goal of this project is to help participants build their understanding of early childhood leadership and gain confidence in their capacity to lead effectively. The project is based on an Early Childhood Leadership Framework that has been developed through 6 years of research on

the role of early childhood leaders in school settings. Participants will work together to explore the Framework and gain a deeper understanding of the purpose of their role as well as practical strategies to implement continuous improvement in the early years. During the project, participants will identify an area of pedagogical practice that they believe can be improved in their school and will be provided with the tools to plan how to lead this change through collaboration with their colleagues and school leadership team.



Leading for and Through Inquiry Project with Kath Murdoch

Leaders and aspiring leaders from 11 schools were excited to commence the year-long project facilitated by renowned inquiry pedagogies expert, Kath Murdoch, and AISWA Early Childhood consultant, Bec Duncan. Day One was rich with conversations about growing a culture of inquiry across K-6 settings, with each school team designing an action research plan, based on one aspect of Kath's 'Community of Inquiry' framework. The project continues over the remainder of 2024, including interviews with highly successful inquiry-based leaders, and numerous further opportunities to learn with Kath.
