
- **Policy Management:** A complete suite of policies and procedures tailored for schools, helping to ensure you have everything you need in one place.

- **Policy Management Platform:** An online platform that is searchable, secure, and accessible on all devices, with version control and audit logs.


We are keen to gauge the interest of schools in this service before proceeding with further discussions and negotiations. Our goal is to find an affordable solution, especially for our smaller schools.

- Significant academic improvements, particularly in literacy and numeracy
- Enhanced social skills

- Higher chances of securing mainstream employment in the future, and
- Greater independence in living arrangements

Trauma Aware Education - National Guidelines

At the School Psychology Association of WA Conference in September 2024, Dr Meegan Brown (Queensland University of Technology) presented on Trauma-Informed Practices in Schools and the <u>National Guidelines</u> for Trauma-Aware Education.

The Guidelines have been developed via a collaboration between the Queensland University of Technology and the Australian Childhood Foundation in response to increasing awareness of the impact of complex trauma on the education and life outcomes for children and young people. There is clear evidence that complex trauma can have a detrimental impact on learning and educational pathways due to the harmful impact of toxic stress on developing nervous systems. This neurobiological impact can impair the capacity for effective relationships and for emotional regulation, which can lead to behavioural and learning complexities that place young students at increased risk of suspension, exclusion, and disengagement from schooling. The document provides guidance at both site and system level to identify elements that will support the development of effective trauma-aware approaches.

AISWA School Psychology Service will be delivering a one-day Professional Development session on Trauma Aware Education on 26 March 2025. Registrations for the event will open in January.





Declaration for a Trauma Aware Education Workforce in Australia

The <u>Declaration for a Trauma-Aware Education Workforce</u> is an output of the fourth, biennial Trauma-Aware Education Conference being held in on 31 October and 1 November 2024 in Brisbane. In seeking support for the Declaration, the authors have written a <u>background paper</u> to provide the evidence base for the Declaration.

The Eucalypt Way - Trauma-informed Education for Australia

<u>The Eucalypt Way</u> is a collaboration between the Berry Street Education Model and the Queensland University of Technology. It provides educators with a pathway to understanding the impacts of trauma on the learning and engagement of children and young people and provides practical steps to support healing and growth.

The eucalypt has been chosen as a metaphor for this work because the species has evolved over millennia to suit the diverse Australian landscape. Eucalypts hold flammable oils and are vulnerable to heat and fire, but they also have unique properties that support their recovery from trauma and allow them to survive and to thrive.





Momentum

 $\underline{\text{Momentum}}$ is a new, online FREE interactive self-help program designed to help young people (7 – 17 yrs) manage feelings of anxiety or unhappiness. The program was developed by clinicians and digital mental health experts from six leading Australian universities, as well as young people, parents, and community and government health partners.

In addition to tailored online treatment programs, Momentum also offers help with sleep difficulties, information on well-being and help-seeking, and tips and information about substance use for adolescents. The program can be worked through at participants' own pace and in the comfort of their own home.

Reportable Conduct Investigation Workshops - Term 4 2024

As part of our continuing work in supporting AISWA schools in the Reportable Conduct Scheme, the WA Ombudsman will be presenting Reportable Conduct Investigation workshops this term.

This workshop is for people already familiar with the Reportable Conduct Scheme who are responsible for conducting investigations of organisation employees in the education sector, including Principals and school leaders.

The Workshop will address:

- How can you manage risks to children in your organisation's care while the investigation is ongoing?
- How will the Ombudsman oversee your organisation's investigation?
- How should your organisation conduct an investigation?
- What happens at the end of a reportable conduct investigation?

It may also be useful to become familiar with the resources available on the Ombudsman WA <u>website</u> before attending the workshop.
