#### **About the Role**

We are currently seeking a nurturing and inclusive Teacher of the Deaf to work in our Outpost Program on a part time basis.

Our Outpost Program provides comprehensive in-school support for students with hearing loss from Kindergarten to Year 12 at our partner primary and secondary schools around the Perth Metropolitan area. The program is designed for students who use oral communication to maximise their active participation in mainstream schools.

Reporting to the Deputy Principal – Outpost, and working in multi-disciplinary team (including psychologists, speech pathologists, audiologists and occupational therapists) the Teacher of the Deaf plays an essential role in delivering high quality and timely education support services to children with hearing loss.

This is a part time position and the successful candidate will be employed on a 0.4 FTE with the days of work to be determined.

### **About You**

To be successful in this role you will have the following:

- Teacher of the Deaf qualifications (current or working towards), or a Teacher with a special needs qualification and experience
- Experience working with children across the primary and high school years with hearing loss, speech and language delay and / or other special needs
- A current registration license with the Teacher Registration Board (TRB).
- The ability to create an inclusive and caring classroom environment that recognises every person's unique talents and fosters positive outcomes
- An ability to work in partnership with families and assisting parents to support their child by providing clear and accurate information
- Excellent communication (both written and verbal) and interpersonal skills to enable professional interaction with a range of people including parents and support staff
- Demonstrated ability to work as part of a collaborative, multi-disciplinary team

- Experience in planning and implementing IEPs to establish both long-term and short-term goals
- A current Working with Children Check and National Police Clearance

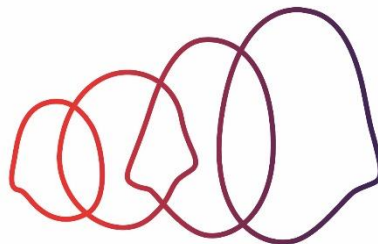
