This is a truly unique teaching role working in our Outpost Program which provides a comprehensive in-school support for students with hearing loss from Kindergarten to Year 12 at our partner primary and secondary schools around the Perth Metropolitan area. The program is designed for students who use oral communication to maximise their active participation in mainstream schools.

This role works as part of a multi-disciplinary team (including psychologists, speech pathologists, audiologists and occupational therapists) where the Teacher plays an essential role in delivering high quality and timely education support services to children with hearing loss.

The successful candidate will be an experienced and qualified Special Needs Teacher or an experienced Teacher with Teacher of the Deaf qualifications (current or working towards) who has the ability to create an inclusive and nurturing environment that recognises every person's unique talent and fosters positive outcomes.

Scholarships for Master's level qualifications are available to Telethon Speech & Hearing employees who have aspirations to build a long-term career supporting children with hearing loss. Scholarships are subject to terms and conditions and based on a formal selection process.

Telethon Speech & Hearing is committed to providing a child safe environment and promoting practices which provide for the safety, wellbeing and welfare of our children, clients and families. Therefore, in addition to the above selection criteria, short listed applicants will also be assessed against their ability to support and maintain a child safe environment.

This is a temporary part time position for the remainder of 2021. The successful candidate will be employed as an 0.8 FTE (working Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) with the possibility of additional hours and contract extension.
